Applicant will have skills required for horse care at a high standard or the capacity and desire to learn the necessary skills. These skills include, but aren't limited to:

- Grooming and washing horses with attention to any soreness, swelling on the body, and any changes in the horse's legs.
- Tacking up, booting, untacking, cooling out horses.
- Cleaning and conditioning equipment and tack
- Turning out horses and participating in paddock management and care to keep turnout safe and peaceful for the horses.
- Cleaning stalls
- Initiative for cleanliness in barn including sweeping, de-cobwebbing, keeping surfaces wiped down with pledge, keeping "human spaces" ie tackroom, viewing room, laundry room, office, bathroom and break room clean to a high standard. Applicant should be comfortable using a power washer to be able to keep stables, aisle and equipment clean.
- Applicant must have fantastic communication skills with the manager and their coworkers in order to keep the horses care seamless.
- Packing and unpacking and setting up and tearing down for horse shows.....must be able to lift heavy objects and trunks.
- Knows, or has the capacity to learn, how to use therapy equipment such as laser, magnetic blankets, foot pads and a vita floor.
- Can administer meds orally in emergency and routine situations.
- Can understand the signs of a sick horse, skin dysfunction and general discomfort.
- Can bandage, poultice, and has a strong sense of first aid care for the horses.
- Can plait or has the capacity to learn and can body clip or has the capacity to learn.
- General organizing to keep equipment tidy, where it belongs and kept in good working order.
- At the shows, the groom needs to aid management in keeping up and tracking timing at the rings. .
- Knows or has the capacity to learn how to cork and uncork in a safe, timely manner.
- Excellent sense of teamwork.....if one person fails, then we all fail.
- Applicant must be willing and comfortable to travel internationally.

Typical hours: 6:30am to 3:00pm 6 days a week and includes a rotational night check duty.
